THE AUTOPSY IS DYING! RISE AND SAVE THE AUTOPSY!

The autopsy has a long history. In the 1800s, before medicine became specialized, clinicians performed autopsies on their own patients to verify their diagnosis and to evaluate treatment. In the 19 th centuries, the autopsy was at the cutting edge of Medicine, a critical part of progress and the essential component of the understanding of the morphologic basis of all disease. The Golden Era of autopsy occurred during the 19 th century, when tens of thousands



of autopsies on adults provided the data base that underlies the basis of modern medicine. Even today, it has a significant role to play in medical progress and in the diagnosis of new diseases (HIV & SARS being the most recent). Unfortunately recent years have seen autopsy rates decline in most countries, a phenomenon which defies logic-given that the autopsy continues to be the gold standard for determining the quality of care. The autopsy rates have plummeted from 50% in 1940s to around 14% in 1980s and currently less than 5% in many hospitals. A variety of societal, medical and technological factors are responsible for the decline of the autopsy, and it is clear that there is no single cause, or even principle cause, for this decline.

In spite of the feeling amongst clinicians that the contemporary investigative tools such as the echocardiogram, CT scan and the MRI, provide them with all the answers they need, many cases still end up with a wrong diagnosis. Some patients die and if a post mortem examination is performed, the case often ends up with a revised diagnosis, one which may have made a significant difference to the outcome, if known in time.

The first autopsy in India was performed on 5th January 1884 at the Grant Medical College, Mumbai. Since then many institutes in our country have worked extensively on autopsy pathology and published several articles on autopsy pathology including neuropathology, cardiovascular pathology and AIDS pathology.

The total numbers of existing medical colleges in our country are 289 (129 Government Medical colleges and 160 Private Medical Colleges). Out of 289 medical colleges only 8 government and semi-government Medical colleges have functional autopsy program. There are few government medical colleges where the autopsies are performed, though with significantly inadequate resources and hence difficulty in getting appropriate testing and drawing appropriate conclusions. While in almost all private medical colleges autopsy program is not functional. Due to non availability of autopsy program, postgraduates are missing out on the fundamental instruction on which the practice of medicine has been built.

As per the guidelines of universities, the autopsy is an essential part of the pathology curriculum. Undergraduate medical students have to attend 10 pathological postmortems and have to record findings of these autopsies in the journals. Similarly, 50 marks are allocated to autopsy exercise at MD pathology examination. Since there is non existence of autopsy program in most of the medical colleges, it is likely that university curriculum is not followed.

The autopsy workshops conducted in the past at the Grant Medical College, Mumbai concludes that postgraduates in pathology are interested to learn the autopsy science; hence we need to revive this dying specialty by acting today. Those institutes having sufficient numbers of autopsies should start organizing autopsy workshops for Post graduates. The course should comprise of didactic lectures, performance of post mortems, autopsy technique demonstration, autopsy specimen demonstrations and discussion of clinico-pathological conferences. In these workshops Postgraduates should be made aware regarding likely emergence of infectious diseases in future (such as the avian flu or Swine flu), and therefore should be taught guidelines of performing infectious autopsies.

To conclude, the decline in autopsy is a progressive one. The blame lies, at least in part, at our own door. It is time for us, the pathologists, to reshape the future by acting now. It is that or death of the autopsy.

IAPM AWARDS AND PRIZES 2009

Applications from IAPM members are invited for the Dr. V. R. Khanolkar Prize, Smt Kunti Devi Mehrotra Award, Prof. K.C. Basu Mallick Award, Best Paper Award of 2009. The applications, complete in all respects should reach the Honorary Secretary by the 31st August 2009.

All applications for the IAPM Awards should include the following:

Five reprints / copies of the published paper along with five copies of the bio-data of the applicant (For the Dr. V.R. Khanolkar Prize and the Smt. Kunti Devi Mehrotra Award only).

- Five copies of the full length paper in the form of a manuscript for the Indian Journal of Pathology and Microbiology (For the Prof K.C. Basu Mallick Award and Best Paper Award only).
- · Certificate from the co-authors, if any, attesting and supporting the candidature of the principal author
- Certificate from all the authors certifying that this research work has been carried out in India .Certificate from all the authors certifying that this work has not received any other award.
- Proof of age (Not required for the Prof K. C.Basu Mallick Award)
- Covering letter indicating the IAPM Membership number
- Letter from Head of the Department/Dean stating that the applicant is eligible for the award in case of postgraduate students / Senior Residents.

Dr. V.R. Khanolkar Prize (2009)

The Dr. V. R. Khanolkar Prize is one of the most prestigious awards of IAPM for published research work. The contest for this prize is open to all members fulfilling the following criteria:

- The contest is open to those below 45 years of age on 31st July 2009.
- The research work submitted should have been carried out in India.
- The above research work should have been published in the preceding two years.
- The Principal author shall submit a statement from his/ her co-authors (if any) supporting his/her candidature for the prize

The publication will be judged by a panel of three judges to be appointed by the President / Honorary Secretary, IAPM. The award may be shared by more than one paper if so adjudged or no prize may be given if no entry is found suitable.

The prize carries a certificate that will be distributed during APCON 2010.

Smt. Kunti Devi Mehrotra (2009)

- The Smt. Kunti Devi Mehrotra Award is another prestigious award given annually for published research work
- The award is open to all members fulfilling the following criteria:
- The applicant should be below 40 years of age on 31st July 2009.
- The research work submitted should have been carried out in India.
- The above research work should have been published by the contesting member as the first author in the: preceding two years.
- The Principal author shall submit a statement from his/ her co-authors (if any) supporting his/her candidature for the award.

The publication will be judged by a panel of three judges, one nominated by the family of Smt Mehrotra and two by the President / Honorary Secretary, IAPM. The award may be shared by more than one paper if so adjudged or no prize may be given if no entry is found suitable

Prof. K.C. Basu Mallick Award (2009)

This award is given to the best paper presented during the Plenary session of the Annual Conference of IAPM.

- There is no age restriction.
- The research work should have been carried out in India.
- The Principal author shall submit a statement from his/ her co-authors (if any) supporting his/her candidature for the award.
- All candidates should submit a full-length text of the research work to be presented in the form of a manuscript for publication.
- The paper shall be scrutinized by a panel of referees selected by the President/ Secretary and a *maximum* of *five* papers will be selected for presentation.
- The time allotted for presentation is generally 10 minutes only.
- The judges for the Plenary Session shall be appointed by the President/ Honorary Secretary maintaining strict confidentiality.
- If none of the presentations are found suitable no award may be given.

Best Paper Award (2009)

This award is given to the best paper presented during the Plenary session of the Annual Conference of IAPM. The rules are similar to the Prof. K.C. Basu Mallick Award except:

- Age below 35 years on 31 December 2008
- A maximum of four papers will be selected for presentation
- The time allotted for presentation is generally 10-12 minutes only.

Oral presentations will be limited to 150 abstracts. Rest of the abstracts will be included as posters.

BEST POSTER AWARD (2009)

To accommodate more free papers during APCON 2009 preference will be given for poster presentation. Those who are presenting posters should bring with them the CD/electronic version of the poster for presentation in plenary session, if selected.

- There will be seven or more poster session on first two days of APCON 2009.
 In each session the best poster will be adjudged by the judges/reviewers.
- The CD of best posters of each session will be allowed to present in the **Plennary Session** on 3rd day morning of APCON 2009. (3 min for presentation, 2 min for discussion)
- During this oral presentation session the best poster adjudged by a panel of judges will be awarded as best poster APCON 2009.
 The prize will be distributed in the valedictory session of APCON 2009.
