Nothing endures but change

The new leaf

Change evokes different feelings to different people under different circumstances. Change is shunned, especially if it is for the worse and in some cases even if it is for the better! Change is likewise welcome. Change can bring joy or sorrow, pleasant surprise or undue pain, calm or even anger. In recent times changes in global environment has renewed our respect for nature. To match this is the equally interesting economic change in the world. The cynosure of all calculations and predictions are centered on two Asian countries: China and India. Actually this economic change is in a way a return to a situation over a century ago: in 1820, China and India accounted for around 49% of the world-wide GDP (Gross Domestic Product). In 1973 this fell to 8%. According to two renowned sources [International Monetary Fund, IMF and Goldman-Sachs], if the top or best base for GDP (market exchange rates) is 100, then for 2005, USA is ranked at the top (100) and China is fourth (20). India does not figure in the top ten of this list. However for the Purchasing Power Parity (PPP) in 2005, while USA tops the list (100), China is second (75) and India is fourth (30), just behind Japan. It is projected that by 2025, both India and China will reach the distinction of 1820 and in 2040 China (100) will forge ahead of USA (95) with India in the third position (45). Thus India is expected to move into an economically advantageous position. Longevity, literacy and GDP per capita are the main indicators of human development. The noted economist and Nobel Laureate Prof Amartya Sen has remarked that "Growth in national income by itself is not enough, if the benefits do not manifest themselves in the form of more food, better access to health and education". Therefore with economic development, improvement in healthcare cannot lag behind.

There is no doubt that infrastructure development including sanitation, safe drinking water, vaccination, improvement in primary health care among other factors are essential to ensure the best possible health of the citizens of this country. However while there will be a strong impetus to improve various specialties, the status of laboratory sciences such as Pathology and Microbiology as always is likely to be lost in the background. This fear is real. It is also unfortunate, since meaningful practice revolves around evidence-based diagnosis and treatment. It must be appreciated that human health has improved more over the past half-a-century than the previous two millennia largely due to prevention, early diagnosis and effective treatment for most diseases. While the contribution of investigation technologies (IT sector!) in this regard is well-known it is invariably associated with high cost. The corporate sector has fortunately and effectively boarded the band-wagon with state of art laboratories that compliment and match clinical services; thus also promoting medical tourism in this country. Up to two decades ago medical colleges were the centers where the general public would throng in case any specialized or expert diagnosis was necessary. Gradually the situation has changed. This is a matter of grave concern. Unless medical colleges get the necessary assistance that includes finances, training will suffer immensely. Where will the staff that can keep abreast of technologies come from, let alone the fate of the poor public who may not enjoy the benefit of improved medical care? Further, will our next generation of teachers in medical colleges not be conversant with the developments that take place everyday? Can underdeveloped Pathology and Microbiology survive in an otherwise developing country? It is time we contemplate on how to help our academic nurseries to turn over a new leaf.

PROF. BIKRAM DAS

Prof. Bikram Das was born in 13th February, 1921 in a family of freedom fighters. His childhood and adolescence was thus nurtured in the cradle of struggle for independence. A freedom fighter to the core he did not allow his academic career come in the way of his patriotism. He was imprisoned several times for participating in the freedom movement. He graduated from Orissa Medical College in 1950. In 1954 he went to the United States of America to work under renowned Professors. He could have continued in

USA but he refused to settle abroad and decided to return and serve his country. He had the rare and unique distinction of being the Founder Professor of two departments: the Department of Pathology and Microbiology, MKCG medical College, Berhampore and the Department of Microbiology, SCB Medical College, Cuttack. He was an excellent teacher and academician. He was an examiner in 19 universities in India. He also was an advisor for the Union Public Service Commission for a decade. Not only was he a Life Member of the Indian Association of Pathologists and Microbiologists (IAPM), he was also a Founder Fellow of the Indian College of Pathologists (ICP). A multifaceted personality, he had a passion for literature. He has over fifty publications that not only includes scientific literature but also novels, travelogues, fictions, essays, poetry and biography.

Prof. Bikram Das left for his heavenly abode on 24 June 2007. Not only have we lost an eminent Professor of Microbiology, but also a respected teacher, a true patriot, a man of plural pursuits and a genius whose imprints strived to enhance human values, knowledge and wisdom. May his soul rest in peace.

IAPM AWARDS

Dr. V. R. Khanolkar Prize [2007]

The Dr. V. R. Khanolkar Prize is one of the most prestigious awards of IAPM for published research work. The contest for this prize is open to all members fulfilling the following criteria:

- ◆ The contest is open to those below 45 years of age on 31st July 2007
- ◆ The research work submitted should have been carried out in India
- ◆ The above research work should have been published in the preceding two years
- ◆ The Principal author shall submit a statement from his/ her co-authors (if any) supporting his/her candidature for the prize

The publication will be judged by a panel of three judges to be appointed by the President / Honorary Secretary, IAPM. The award may be shared by more than one paper if so adjudged or no prize may be given if no entry is found suitable

The prize carries a certificate that will be distributed during APCON 2008

Smt. Kunti Devi Mehrotra [2007]

The Smt. Kunti Devi Mehrotra Award is another prestigious award given annually for published research work.

The award is open to all members fulfilling the following criteria:

The applicant should be below 40 years of age on 31st July 2007

The research work submitted should have been carried out in India

The above research work should have been published by the contesting member as the first author in the preceding two years

The Principal author shall submit a statement from his/ her co-authors (if any) supporting his/her candidature for the award

The publication will be judged by a panel of three judges, one nominated by the family of Smt Mehrotra and two by the President / Honorary Secretary, IAPM. The award may be shared by more than one paper if so adjudged or no prize may be given if no entry is found suitable

Applications for the Dr. V. R. Khanolkar Prize, Smt Kunti Devi Mehrotra Award, Prof. K.C. Basu Mallick Award, Best Paper Award [2007]

All applications for the IAPM Awards should include the following:

Five reprints / copies of the published paper along with five copies of the bio-data of the applicant [For the Dr. V.R. Khanolkar Prize and the Smt. Kunti Devi Mehrotra Award only]

Five copies of the full length paper in the form of a manuscript for the Indian Journal of Pathology and Microbiology [For the Prof. K.C. Basu Mallick Award and Best Paper Award only]

Certificate from the co-authors, if any, attesting and supporting the candidature of the principal author

Certificate from all the authors certifying that this research work has been carried out in India Certificate from all the authors certifying that this work has not received any other award.

Proof of age (Not required for the Prof. K.C.Basu Mallick Award)

Covering letter indicating the IAPM Membership number

Letter from Head of the Department / Dean stating that the applicant is eligible for the award in case of postgraduate students / Senior Residents

The above applications, complete in all respects should reach the Honorary Secretary by the 30 September 2007

Prof. K.C. Basu Mallick Award [2007]

This award is given to the best paper presented during the Plenary session of the Annual Conference of IAPM.

- There is no age restriction
- The research work should have been carried out in India
- ◆ The Principal author shall submit a statement from his/ her co-authors (if any) supporting his/her candidature for the award
- ◆ All candidates should submit a full-length text of the research work to be presented in the form of a manuscript for publication
- ◆ The paper shall be scrutinized by a panel of referees selected by the President/ Secretary and a maximum of five papers will be selected for presentation
- The time allotted for presentation is generally 10 minutes only
- ◆ The judges for the Plenary Session shall be appointed by the President/ Honorary Secretary maintaining strict confidentiality

If none of the presentations are found suitable no award may be given

Best Paper Award [2007]

This award is given to the best paper presented during the Plenary session of the Annual Conference of IAPM. The rules are similar to the Prof. K.C. Basu Mallick Award except:

- ◆ Age below 35 years on 31 December 2006
- ◆ A maximum of four papers will be selected for presentation
- ◆ The time allotted for presentation is generally 10-12 minutes only
