

Hippocrates

The Master: more or less..

The capabilities of mankind are endless. History proves that accomplished thinkers, scientists, musicians, poets and other virtues and skills can be found in different combinations in the same individual. This is also true today and we have to just look into our lives to recall such individuals. Many are gifted, some are trained while others hone their skills to accomplish. Paul Ehrlich [1854-1915] for example was a immunologist, discovered stains (he was responsible for staining the tubercle bacillus discovered by Robert Koch) discovered drugs for treating diseases such as trypanosomiasis and syphilis, was credited with introducing liver biopsies... the list is endless. He was awarded the Nobel Prize in Medicine and Physiology with Metchnikoff in 1908. Such examples are rare. Medical education and training has undergone a sea of change. Over the years there has been an incremental advance in conventional training in our country starting with graduation earlier considered to be sufficient, to house-staffships for a year or two after internship in a particular subject and postgraduation beginning with diplomas and then degrees. Thus specialization came into being and a specialist was the order of the day. This did not stop here. Advancement in knowledge and knowhow gave birth to superspecialization. Today there are over fifty branches or subcategories of medical sciences. Only some branches seem to retain faith in their in the original division : obstetrics and gynecology being one although experts in fertility / infertility, endocrine, laproscopic gynecology are available; radio-diagnosis being another in addition to anatomy, physiology and biochemistry.

Close on the heels of such conservatives are the breed of Pathologists and Microbiologists (who were rolled into one perhaps on the basis of pathogenesis and the use of the microscope, have nevertheless separated out). Pathology and Microbiology have contributed to the development of specialist branches and therefore it is ironical that they have not formally branched out further. In keeping with the tremendous explosion in knowledge, while loyalty to research interests are invariably confined, the same is not true for diagnostic proficiency. Everyone is assumed to be an expert in all aspects of the postgraduate curriculum. Obviously, it would not be fair at all to expect the same individual to examine a urine sediment, and diagnose pityriasis lichenoidis et varioloformis acuta as well as glioblastoma multiforme or a congenital dyserythropoietic anemia type III with equal flair! Similarly a microbiologist may not be equally at ease with isolating and identifying nonaerobic bacteria, basidobolus, acanthameoba or an adenovirus. This is expected. Even bowling and batting seem to be incompatible specialties as much as kicking a corner or a penalty is. Hidden super-specialization is nevertheless apparent especially in academic institutions. Special interests or, to put it better, experts have silently surfaced in several institutions. These include specialist neuropathologists, renal pathologists, hematologists, oncopathologists, lymphopathologists, gastrointestinal pathologists, liver pathologists, gynecpathologists and cytopathologists: some with formal training, others with knowledge handed over by their mentors and still others who have learnt by the hardest method available-through experience.

Are such specialists readily available? Or even required? With a boom in the health sector with over 25400 laboratories in India, even those hospitals that are flooded with reputed super specialists in every hue and form prefer to employ one pathologist or less [principle of least common factor] who is expected to report kidney, liver, gastrointestinal, bronchial, lymph node biopsies matching the competence of the nephrologist, hepatologist, gastroenterologist, pulmonologist and the oncologist. All these specialist physicians would have undergone a further training of three years concentrating on their specialty alone after postgraduation in medicine. The matching pathologist or microbiologist is extremely unlikely to be abreast with all such requirements in general, although exceptional individuals do exist. The consequence is a state of induced dyspnoea where the hospital perceives a deficiency in the expectations from the pathologists. Comparisons are invariably made to other experts in the individual field available elsewhere much to the dismay of the pathologist. This is unfair. A single pillar is not sufficient to support present high-rises

The question that now arises is should we begin super-specialization in pathology and microbiology? Or is the time too premature for Jacks to become Masters? Unanimity on this matter is not expected as this would herald a new era for mankind! The argument against such specialization is practical. Can there be a pathologist or microbiologist for every specialty in one hospital? Smaller hospitals can ill afford more than one pathologist and a microbiologist. Further, out of sight is out of mind. Practicing in one confined field for several years would mean attrition of skills in others. Therefore post-retirement jobs are doubtful. On the other side there seems to be apparent merit in some form of specialized training after postgraduation. If not a DM degree in histopathology, virology etc., this could be in the form of Fellowships [currently available in a limited form]. Or should the duration of postgraduation be increased to five years as in most countries overseas?

The time is however just right for deliberations on this matter by peers in our fields for the sake of our patients, our colleagues and above all the future these branches of medicine in our country. This will shape not only avenues in diagnostic acumen but also on focused and concentrated research in our country. To progress perhaps we do need to know more and more of less and less!

OBITUARY

Dr. G.V. TALWALKAR MD, M.Sc. FCPS

Dr. G.V. Talwalkar was born on 18th April 1923 in the erstwhile state of Baroda. After his matriculation from Baroda he graduated (B.Sc.) from Elphinston College, Mumbai. He subsequently joined the Grant Medical College, Mumbai and obtained the M.B.B.S. degree in 1948. Here he planned his career in Pathology and in 1949 joined as a staff of the Department of Pathology Tata Hospital. In 1951, he was deputed to join a one-year residency program in pathology at Mount Sinai Hospital, New York. After completing the residency, he returned to India in 1952. He joined the Tata Memorial Hospital and under the guidance of Late Dr. V. R. Khanolkar, then Head of the Department, completed his post graduation. He continued in Tata Memorial Hospital to head the department in 1975.



The Department of Pathology, Tata Memorial Hospital, grew to new heights under his able leadership. He was a man of four D's. Dedication, Determination, Discipline & Devotion. He was a visionary and encouraged all staff members to develop different specialties in Pathology. He pioneered the establishment of lymph node pathology as a specialty in

India. He was renowned for his skills in the diagnosis of lymphomas (which is a difficult subject) in India and aboard. He started conducting autopsies in cancer patients especially in Leukemia cases to learn more about the biology of cancer. It was under his tenure that the department obtained recognition for M.Sc and Ph.D degrees. He was a recognized post-graduate teacher for MD (Path), M.Sc. & Ph.D. in applied biology. He visualized the need for expansion of the pathology department with changing times and not only laid the foundation for a modern histopathology laboratory but also planned the establishment of electron microscopy and immunohistochemistry way back in 1984. He established FNAC as diagnostic technique in the department in 1985

In 1983 he became the first elected President of IAPM. He also became President of Indian Association of Hematology and Blood Transfusion. Very few may be aware that he was the founder member of Bombay Hematology Group. He was also the founder member of Asian Pacific Association of Pathologists, the first conference of which was held in 1987 at Rawalpindi. He was then specially invited to give a talk on Spectrum of lymphoma in India. He was also instrumental in making IAPM a member of the World Association of Societies of Pathology.

His main fields of research interest in Pathology were Hodgkin's Disease, Nuclear Magnetic Resonance and Rhinoscleroma He had traveled all over India & world to deliver lectures, key note addresses and to participate at various conferences, symposia and workshops on oncopathology, hematology. He has more than 150 publications in various national and international scientific journals.

Some of the qualities he possessed were transparency, humility, discipline, loyalty to institution, perseverance, quest for knowledge and hard work. No wonder then, he was considered to be an excellent administrator. He was very encouraging teacher and was a fatherly figure to all the staff members who were like a large joint family. Behind the strict figure was a kind and humane person.

After retirement in 1985, he joined as a consultant pathologist at S.L.Raheja Hospital where he remained active till 2000. Even after retirement his interest in pathology and cricket continued.

He died peacefully on March 9, 2006.


May his soul rest in peace.
