Karnataka Chapter. On 15th Oct'2022 KCIAPM Path webinarsession-2 was conducted on "Diagonstic approach to soft tissue tumors" by Dr. AnuradhanC.K. Rao. On 9th Nov'2022, Panel Discussion on Pathology: Backbone of Clinical Medicinewas conducted by Dr. Jayaram Iyengar, Dr. Vani Ravi Kumar, Dr. Vidys M.V., Dr. Umashankar T. & Dr. Mahesh Karigoudar. Karnataka chapter organized a very successful 70thannual Pathology conference "APCON 2022"in hybrid mode at MS Ramaih medical college Bangalore.

Madhya Pradesh Chapter: On 18.9.2022 SAMC & PGI Department of Pathology SAIIMS Indore conducted a lecture on Topic - Recent Advances in WHO Classification of Soft tissue Tumours by Dr. Bharat Rekhi, a workshop on LBC by Dr Reeni Malik and a workshop on IHC by Dr Shikha Ghanghoria. CME on entometrium reporting on 18/11/22 & CME on flow cytometry Dr Gautam Gopal Bhagwat.

North East Chapter: 31st NERCON, the annual conference of NE Regional chapter was organized from 25th November to 27th November 2022. The Prof B D Baruah oration was delivered by



Dr Anita M Borges, Mumbai. The other guest faculties were Dr Debadutta Basu and Dr Siddaraju from JIPMER, Pondicherry and Dr Santosh Menon from Tata Memorial hospital, Mumbai. More than 300 delegates attended the conference.

Uttar Pradesh Chapter: UPPATHCON 2022, the XXIXth Annual Conference of UP chapterof IAPM was held on 15th and 16th October 2022 at Govt Institute of Medical Sciences, Greater Noida, which was attended by over 500 delegates. The lecture topics included Pediatric Gliomas, Liquid Based Cytology, Lymphomas of GI tract, Endometrial Carcinoma, Molecular Diagnosis of Lung Neoplasms, Hepato-bilary Neoplasms, 2022 Classification of Thyroid Neoplasma, Papillary Lesions of Breast, WHO classification of Neuroendocrine Tumors, and Pitfalls in Bladder Neoplasms. Slide sessions on interesting cases in Hematology and the Eccentric in histopathology were also conducted. 122 Oral papers, 130 e-posters, and Award category papers were presented. Oganizing chairperson was Dr. Shivani Kalhan & Org Secretary Dr Shalini Bahadur. Newly elected office bearers of UP chapter: Dr Shivani Kalhan (President), Dr Pradyumn Singh (Vice President), Dr Atin Singhai (Secretary), Dr Surabhi Pandey (Joint Secretary), Dr Anupam Varshney (Treasurer), Dr Ranjan Agrawal was nominated as Chairman, Scientific Committee. A workshop on "Basic Molecular Diagnostic Techniques" was conducted by Molecular Diagnostics and Research Laboratory, Government Institute of Medical Sciences, Greater Noida on 3rd& 4th November 2022. 28 delegates participated in workshop and learnt 'Molecular Techniques and their application in clinical diagnosis VRDL network:

The topic of Dr. R N Ghosh Memorial CME was "The O and Y of Ovarian Neoplasm" - focusing on the light microscopic approach, Immunohistochemical and molecular algorithm, in current understanding of ovarian Neoplasm. A panel discussion on pitfalls and progress in Ovarian neoplasm, and interesting case presentation from different medical colleges were the part of the CME. The 29th State

It was followed by Dr. S N De memorial oration by IAPM President Dr. Kim Vaipheion virtual mode. There was a microbiology symposium on "CBNAAT - use and misuse, a clinical rendezvous". It was followed by Award papers, Free papers and Posters on histopathology, cytology, microbiology and haematology with 92 participations from PGTs. The overall registration was more than 300.

Proposals to start new chapters: One proposal by Dr Sunita Singh, Prof & Head, Pathology, PGIMS, Rohtak to start Haryana chapter. Second proposal by Dr. Jyotsana Suri, Professor of Pathology and Dr. Subhash Bhardwaj, Prof & Head of Pathology, GMC Jammu to start Jammu and Kashmir chapter of IAPM.

F Agenda No. 01: Condolences:

☞ Agenda No.03: Confirmation of minutes of 69th GBM at APCON 2021

Resolution Agenda No 03/2022: The issue regarding APCON 2016 was raised by Dr. Anuradha Phatak. After discussion and deliberations, GB accepted the following points-

- 1. To solve the issue anenquiry committee was constituted comprising Dr. Kim Vaiphei, Dr.(Col) D.K.Mishra, Dr. Pradeep Vaideeswar, Dr. Vatsala Misra, Dr. Asaranti Kar, Dr. Varsha Dhume (past treasurer) and Dr. Harendra Kumar (present treasurer) which will enquire the issue and solve it.
- 2. It was decided to make a document of all irregularities occurring since APCON 2016 and keep in HQ.
- 3. SBI account from Jaipur will be transferred to place of new treasurer, Agra
- 4. The hard copies of fixed deposits (Rs 50 lakhs) done by Dr. Dilip Ramrakhiani will be transferred from Jaipur to IAPM HQ.

- 5. Interest generated by DCB bank and SBI SMS Jaipur bank accounts of Rs 18,588/ &Rs137,407/ will be paid by APCON 2016.
- 6. Handover meeting will be held in month of January/ February. Travel and other expenses will be borne by IAPM.
- 7. Because of the difficulties faced from APCON 2016, it was decided to prepare a financial SOP by Executive committee members, which will be handed over to the organising secretary of each APCON.
- 8. Minimum 10% of registration fees to be donated by every APCON organising committee after completion of conference.

**Agenda No. 04: Report of Honorary Secretary, IAPM:

Resolution: Agenda No.04/2022: The general body accepted the report of the Secretary, IAPM for the year 2022. During the tenure of Honouray Secretary, IAPM many commendable works were done like: starting of IAPM webinars, online EC & GB meetings and with the office bearers of state chapters, institution of Dr.KSRatnakar Best paper award, modification of bye laws with multiple amendments occurring since 2006, formation of new chapters like J&K & Haryana. EC and GB appreciated and congratulated Dr.Asaranti Kar for her successful tenure.

Agenda No.05: Report of Joint Honourary Secretary, IAPM

Resolution: Agenda No. 05/2022: The general body accepted the report of Honourary joint secretary IAPM for the year 2022. GB approved formation of new chapters of IAPM like Jammu & Kashmir & Haryana. However, GB expressed concern over inactivity of some chapters and urged for elections to be held every year in all the chapters. Steps are to be taken regarding continuation of same office bearers in chapters like Rajasthan and Gujrat. NW chapter has been revived by the three members' committee appointed by IAPM with Prof.Harpreet Kaur, HOD, Dept. of Pathology of DMC, Ludhiana as interim Chairperson till next GBM scheduled in April 2023.

** Agenda No.6: Report of Honourary Treasurer

Resolution: Agenda No. 06/2022: The general body accepted the report of Honourary treasurer IAPM for the year 2022. The following points are suggested after discussion regarding treasurer's report:

1. Same auditor and CA to continue for the year 2023-24. If asked, increase in fees can be given to auditor.

- 2. Rs20,000/ to be given to CA Mr. KK Nayak for his previous work done for IJPM during 2017-18.
- 3. Signature of President (2022), secretary (2020-22) and treasurer (2020-22) are required to authorise the new treasurer (elected for the period 2023-25) to transfer the signatories in bank accounts.
- 4. To close all FDs in banks except SBI after maturation and to keep the hard copies of FDs in HQ.
- 5. Rs 31,434 in name of Dr.Satyanarayan to be written off.
- 6. Payment portals in website for membership to include new options.

Agenda No. 07: Report of Honourary Editor-in-Chief, Indian Journal of Pathology & Microbiology

Resolution: Agenda No. 07/2022: The general body accepted the report of Honourary Editor-in-Chief, IJPM for the year 2022. GB congratulated Dr. Ranjan Agrawal for uplifting the standard of IJPM and increasing the impact factor. Dr. Ranjan Agrawal suggested that as a membership benefit, those who apply for Life Membership of IAPM would be given an additional option of having a Print (Hard) copy of IJPM at an additional cost of Rs 2500/ per year or a single copy at Rs 500/ per issue. This additional payment would be in the account of Editor-in-Chief, while the membership fees would be in the treasurer's account.

**Agenda No. 8: Report of Honourary Joint Secretary, IAPM HQ:

Resolution: Agenda No. 08/2022: The general body accepted the report of Honourary Joint secretary, IAPM HQ for the year 2022:

- a. Lift issue- HQ lift issue was discussed and it was decided that it should be finished ASAP. Dr.Lanjewar suggested that no more money will be given from IAPM for lift which was agreed upon by Joint secretary, HQ.
- b. HQ Budget for the year 2023-24 was approved.

**Agenda No. 09: Report of Secretary, Indian College of Pathologists:

Resolution: Agenda No.09/2022: The General body accepted the report of the Secretary, ICP, Dr UshaKini for the year 2022. Secretary stated that website has become functional and will become interactive soon. Dr. Shantveer G. Uppin & Dr. Megha Uppin were awarded FICP in this year APCON. PDCC course was conducted successfully and 10 cleared the examination.



Agenda No.10: Admission of new members to IAPM:

Resolution: Agenda No.10/2022: The GB accepted the proposal of conferring membership to 239 applicants, who had applied for membership by 31st October 2022. They were OL members who according to new Bye laws became life members.

Agenda No.11: Election 2022:

Nominations were received for posts of the President, Vce President, Honourary Secretary, Honourary Joint Secretary and Honourary Treasurer.

- **a.** Declaration of results for the post of President 2023:Only one nomination was received from Dr. SharadaRane, for the post of President, IAPM.
- **Resolution:** Agenda No.11a/2022: The General body accepted the election of Dr. Sharada Rane to the post of president IAPM 2023, unopposed.
- b. Declaration of results for the post of Vice-President, 2023: Valid nominations were received from Dr. Dilip Ramrakhiani, Dr. Kanaklata Dei & Dr. Ranjan Agrawal. Dr. Ranjan Agrawal withdrew his nomination. So there was context for the post between Dr. Dilip Ramrakhiani & Dr. Kanaklata Dei. Election was held electronically from 26th -29th October and result was declared during EC meeting on 2nd December by Secretary, IAPM. Total voting this year was 682; Dr. Dei received 386 votes and Dr. Ramrakhiani received 285 votes.

DR. R.V.AGRAWAL

Dr. Ram Vilas Agrawal, was born on 15th March 1934 at Raipur. He did his schooling and premedical education at Raipur. He was an alumnus of GMC Nagpur, completing MBBS in 1957. He joined as house surgeon in GMC Nagpur on 10/01/1959 and completed his MD Pathology & Bacteriology in 1963.

His teaching career started on 14/01/1960 in GMC Nagpur under Dr. J. B. Srivastava as Professor and HOD (later the Director General of Health Services, GOI).

In the department of Pathology at Nagpur, Dr. B. K. Aikat (Director Professor, PGIMER Chandigarh), Dr. K. D. Sharma (DMER& Director Haffkine Institute), Dr. B. R. Solanki (research worker in sickle cell) and Dr. Shobha Grover (ICMR centre for cytopathology) were his illustrious colleagues. He also held the additional charge of Professor in FMT in GMC Nagpur till 13/12/1970, where he developed postmortem and autopsy services.

On deputation he joined MGIMS, Sevagram, Wardha as Professorof Pathology on 14/12/70 till 11/1/1976.Dr. R.V.Agrawal joined MGIMS from GMC Nagpur with stalwarts like Dr. Vishwanar, of Physiology and Dr. M.L. Sharma from Pharmacology at the behest of Dr. SushilaNayar.MGIMS being a pioneering venture, Dr. Agrawal not only set up the Dept. of Pathology but also developed work ethics commensurate with Gandhian way of life.He set up diagnostic work in histopathology for leprosy, filariasis and TB along with world renowned leprologist Dr. Desikan and Dr. A.R.Shukla, an ophthalmologist saving eye sights of leprosy patients. He was instrumental in setting up an excellent PG courses in Pathology which was integrated with teaching in camps, community sevices and ROME (re-orientation of medical education).

He thenrejoined government service at BJMC, Pune on 12/01/1976 as Professor and Head, Dept of Pathology till 5/09/1988 with Dr. B. S. Raichur as his predecessor. He excelled in PG teaching with daily slide diagnosis sessions (ting-ting seminars). Autopsy services of Pathology excelled with more than 1000 clinical post mortems conducted by residents and post graduate students under his guidance. Department of surgical Pathology, hematology and cytology excelled under his guidance with 10 Associate Professors and 20 lecturers working tirelessly with him. He conducted inter departmental activities like death audits, death conferences and CPCs with his medical and surgical colleagues. He always encouraged research paper presentations in National Conferences with a large contingent of more than 20 delegates attending these National Conferences. He had collected thousands of systemic and surgical pathology slides and he donated his collection to department of Pathology, BJMC Pune.

He was promoted as Dean to GMC Aurangabad on 06/09/1989, till 16/09/1989, then transferred to VMGMC Solapur and then to BJMC Pune where he served as Dean till his retirement in March 1992.

He returned to academics as Professor of Pathology at Bharti Vidyapeeth Pune for the next 10 years. He was instrumental in setting up the department and illustrative museum there.

Dr. R. V. Agrawal was a gifted and devoted teacher, a pathologist of great repute, an academician par excellence, an extremely considerate administrator, a thorough gentlemen and a genuine humanist, a loving and caring popular teacher. He has 50 research publications to his credit.

He was "Bhishmacharya" for his PG students who would go out of the way toteach, groom, train them to become reasonably good pathologists.

He was the President of Research Society of BJMC and SGH, Pune.

He had organized National Conference on blood bank and was the Organizing secretory of MAPCON 1982 held at Mahabaleshwar, organized by BJMC Pune. He started quarterly pathology meets of slide seminars to discuss interesting cases under the aegis of Poona Pathologists and Microbiologists Association.

The President and office bearers of IAPM deeply condole the passing away of Dr. R. V. Agrawal. He will always be fondly remembered by thousands of his students and colleagues. May he guide us in our journey as pathologists and diagnosticians.
